Revenue Highlights

- Water Sales & Lake Operations \$1.2 million increase (4%)
 - Canyon water rate of \$147 per AFY \$2 increase (1.3%) over current year
 - Overall increase in water sales due to growth in divisions
 - Rate increases in the Rural Water Distribution System to align with AWWA (American Water Works Association standards)
 - No rice crop revenue
- Wastewater Services \$2.1 million increase (40%)
 - Anticipated increase in services due to growth Dunlap, Buda, 4S Ranch, Johnson Ranch, Bulverde Singing Hills, Cordillera
 - 10% rate increase for Canyon Park and Dunlap monthly fee
- Miscellaneous and Grant \$945,000 decrease (50%)
 - Only grants which have been "awarded" or continuing are included in current year

Expense Highlights

- Personnel Costs \$1.6 million increase (9.9%)
 - Ten additional FTEs
 - Increase in budget for wages and benefits of 5%; increasing cost of healthcare
- Operating Costs \$2 million increase (12.7%)
 - Increase in utility, chemical, and disposal costs
 - Addition of fleet lease expense
 - Costs associated with environmental requirements
 - Increased water deliveries
 - Professional Services (engineering, electrical consultant, recreation master plan, water rights consulting, rate study)



Expense Highlights

- Capital Outlay \$832,000 decrease (42.9%)
 - Many capital projects funded in 2018 were multi-year and funds will carry forward into Capital Improvement Program. Examples include:
 - Gate rehabilitation/repair/replacement
 - Asset management program
 - Drive-by meter reading system for Rural Water
 - Additions include:
 - Additional funding for meter reading system
 - Vehicle and equipment replacements
- Transfer to Designated Project Funds \$1.5 million
 - Additional funds for asset management, Dunlap collection system improvements, siphon/radial gate improvements, Rural water system improvements
- Debt Service New Braunfels office expansion



Staffing Additions/Changes

- Purpose of Staffing Additions
 - Fully support growing operations
 - Development of new programs
 - Investment in GBRA assets including infrastructure and personnel
 - Ensure continuity of operations and transfer of institutional knowledge as part of succession planning

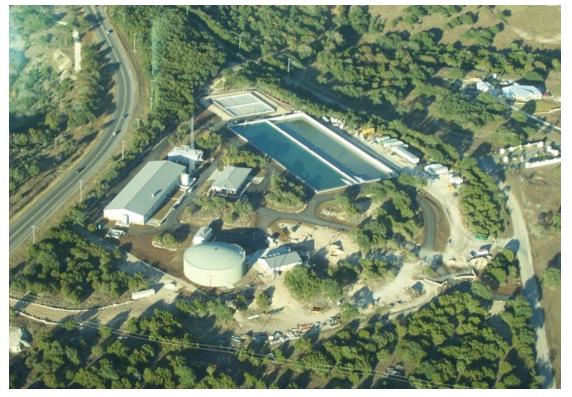
